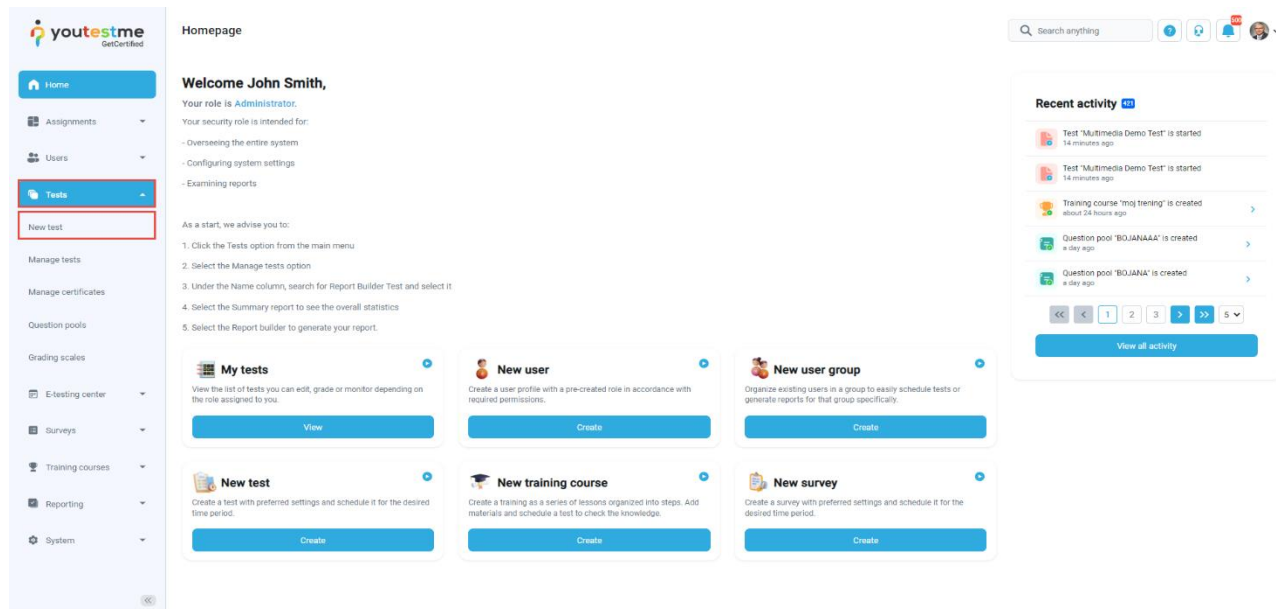
This document explains how to achieve the following requirement:

2 Steps

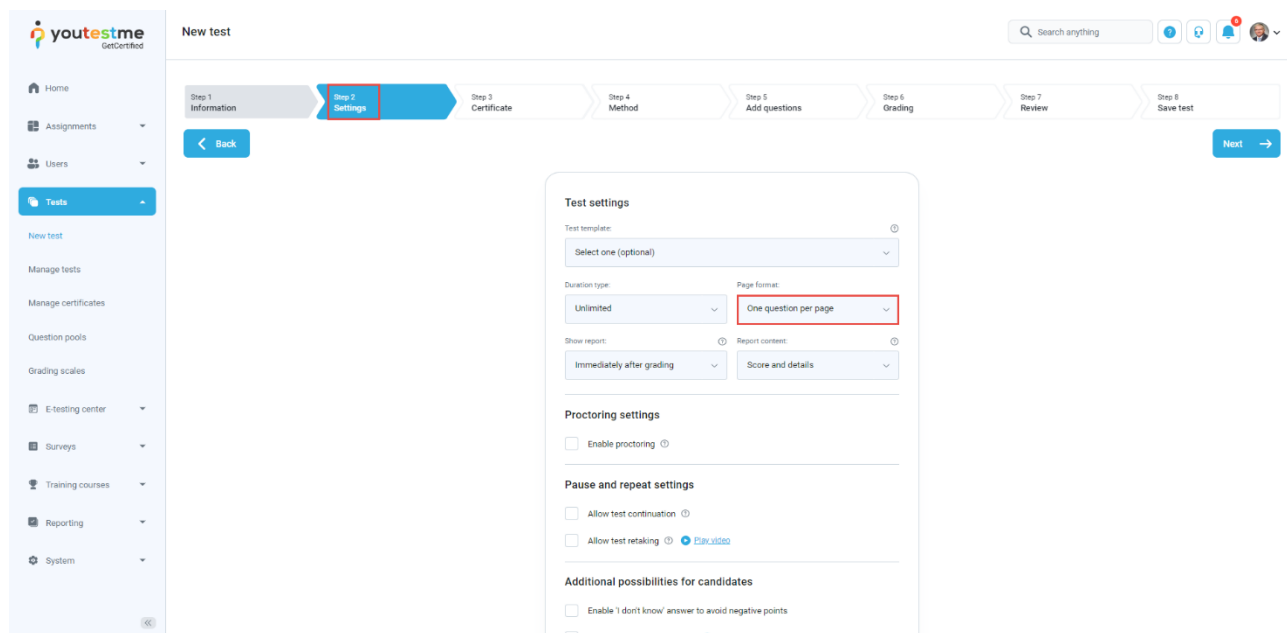
2.1 Creating a test

Hover over the **Tests** in the main menu and select **New test**.



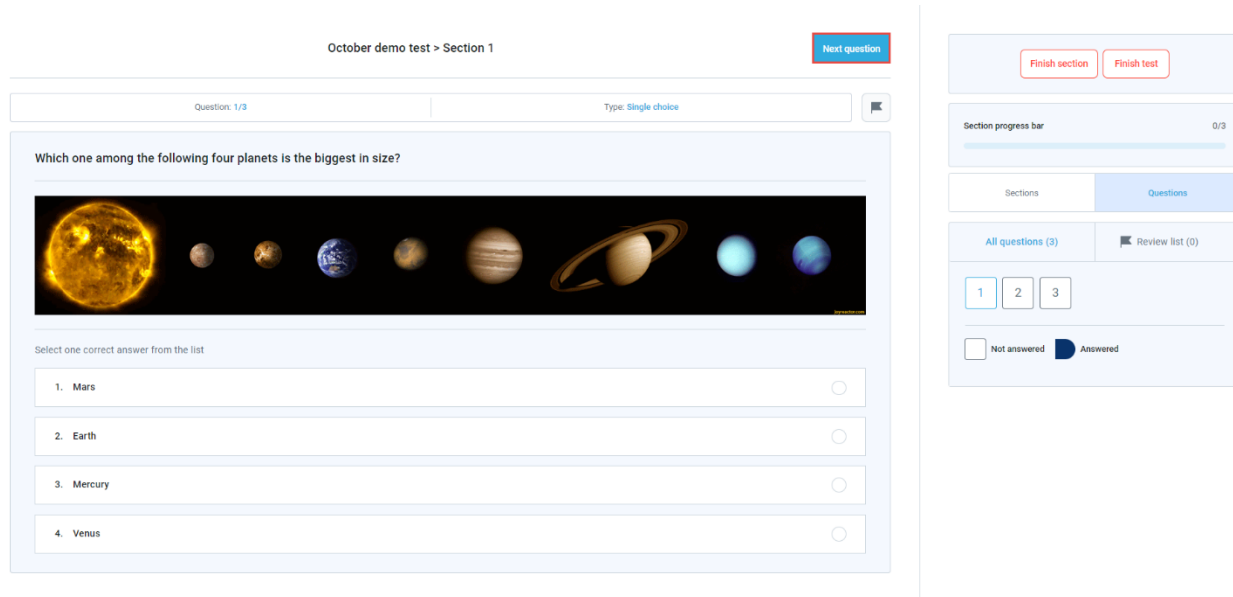
2.1.1 Present one question at a time

On the second step - **Settings**, for the **Page format** option, choose **One question per page**.



2.1.2 Candidate's perspective

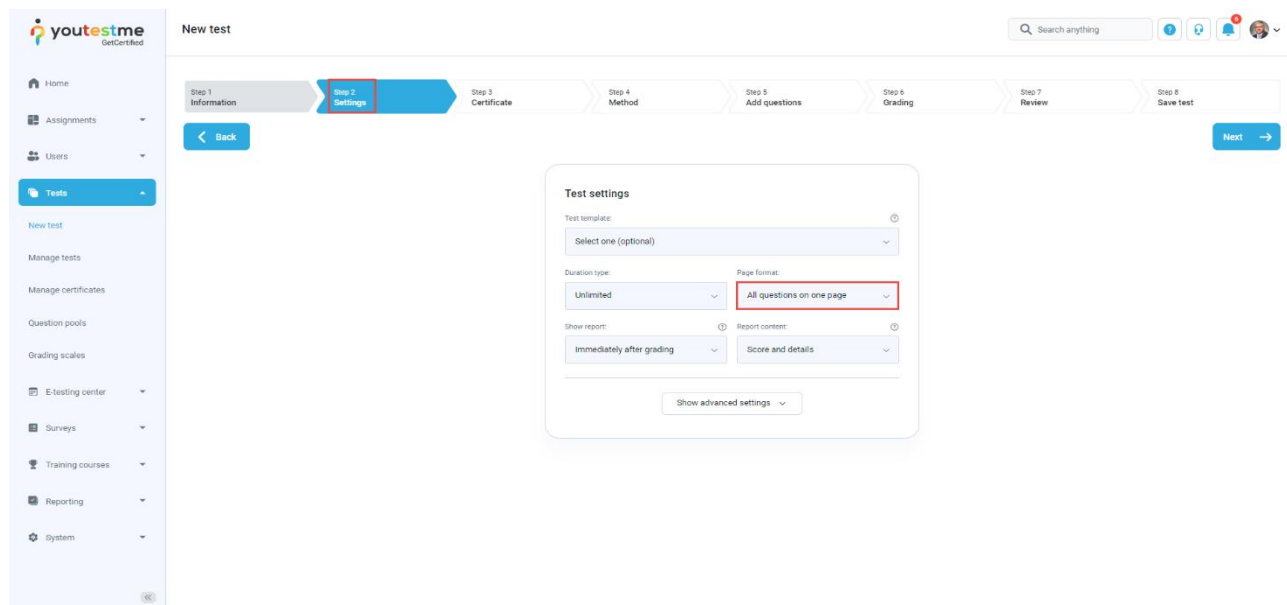
During the test-taking process, questions will be presented in the following way:



Note: To go to the next question on the next page, the candidate should click on the **Next question** button in the lower right corner.


2.1.3 Present all questions at once
