1 Introduction

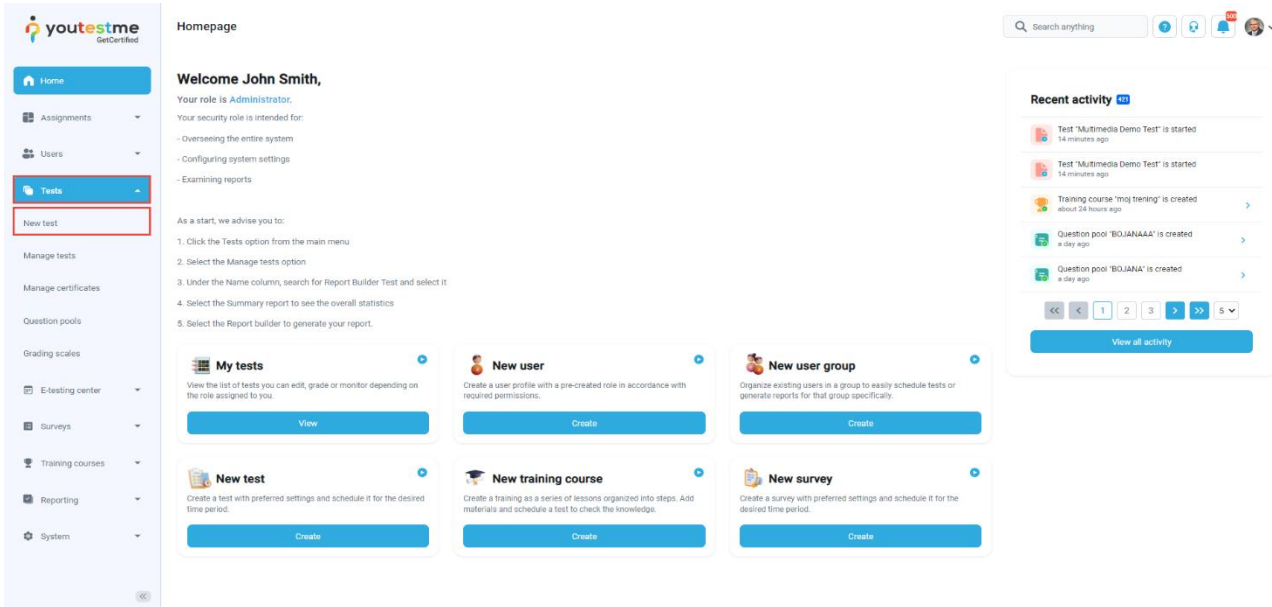
This document explains how to achieve the following requirement:

2 Steps

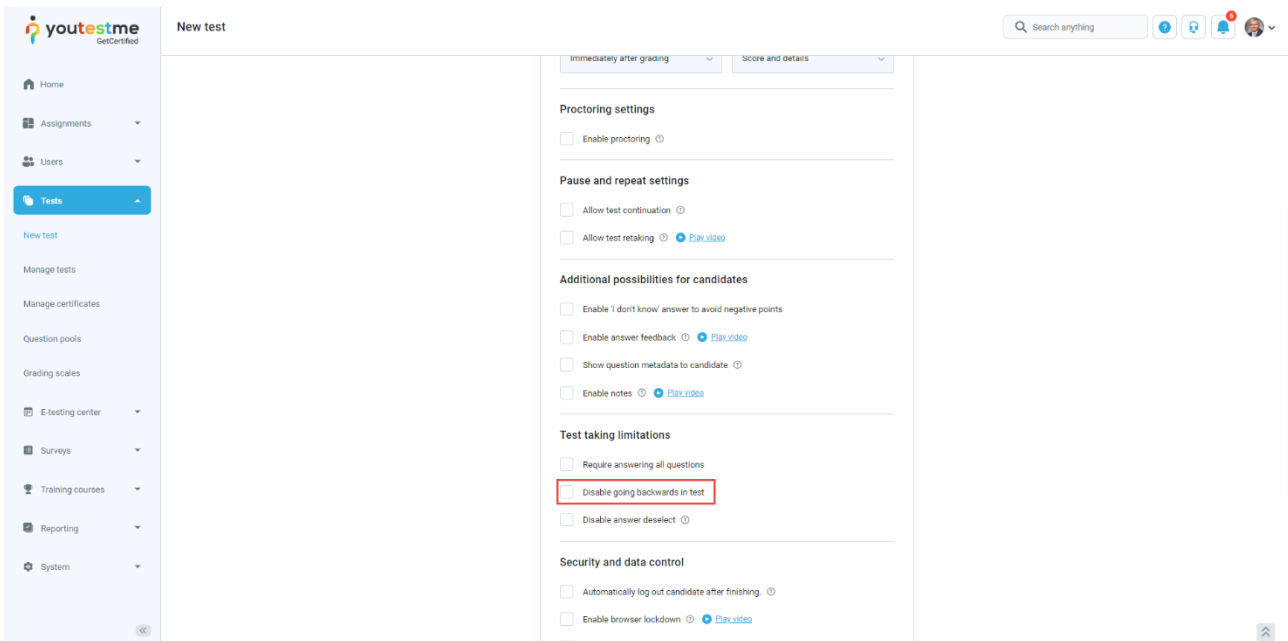
2.1 Creating a test

Hover over the **Tests** in the main menu and select **New test**.



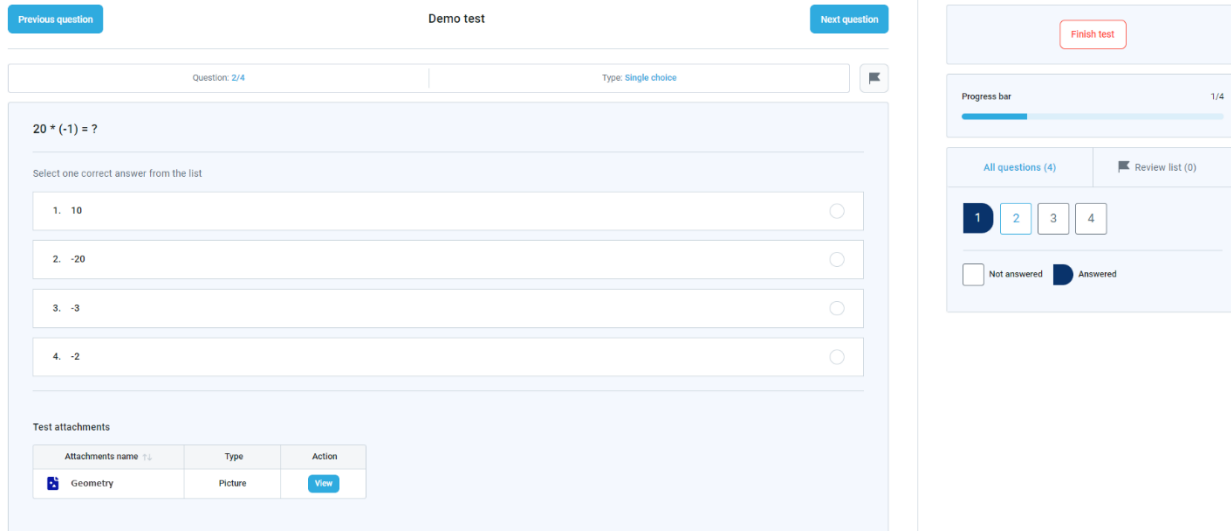
2.1.1 Allow students to go back to previous questions

In the second step - **Settings**, leave the **Disable going backwards in test** option unchecked.



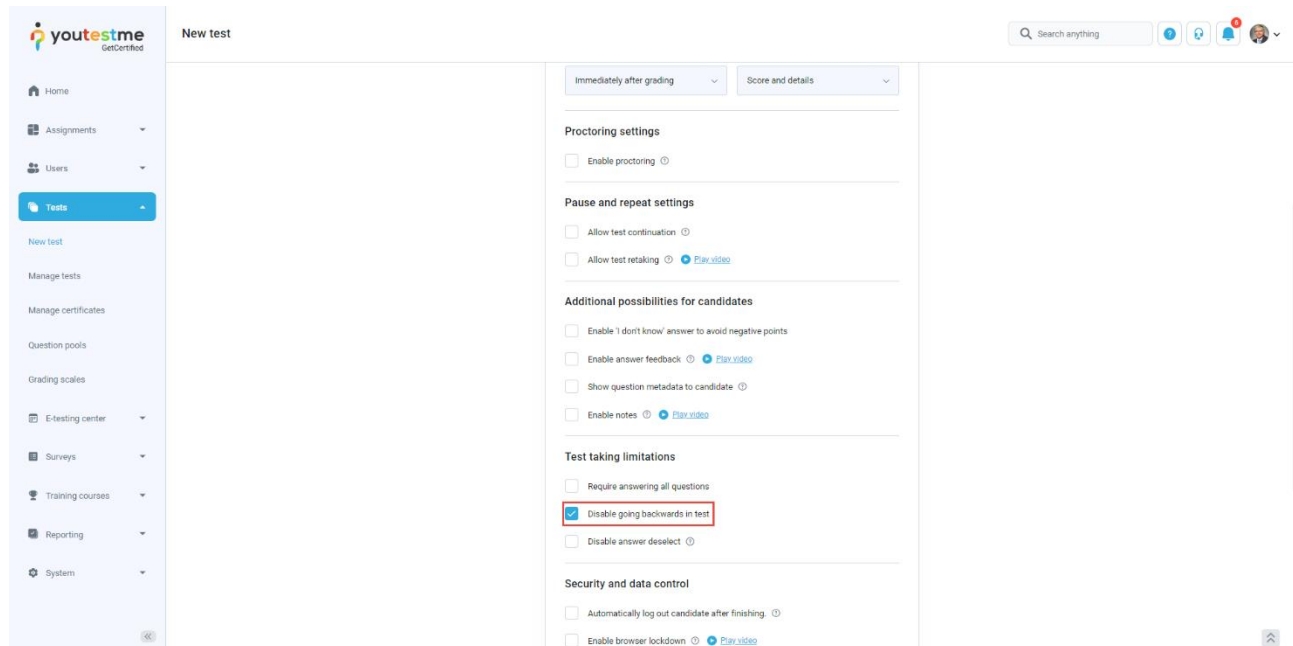
2.2 Candidate's perspective

During the test-taking process, students will be able to go to the previous question by clicking on the **Previous question** button.




2.2.1 Disallow students to go back to previous questions

In the second step - **Settings**, leave the **Disable going backwards in test** option unchecked.




2.2.2 Candidate's perspective

Students will not be able to go to the previous question during the test-taking process, and the **Previous question** button does not exist.
